ACES: Augmentative Communication and Empowerment Supports
—nationally and internationally recognized program
for individuals who use augmentative and alternative
communication (AAC) devices.

AAC users receive 2 weeks of intensive instruction “in residence” at Temple University’s main campus, plus 1 year of follow-along services.

- ✓ ***become a more effective communicator***
 - Develop skills for using your AAC device
 - Customize your AAC device
 - Store and retrieve vocabulary
 - Develop/improve public speaking skills
 - Make more functional use of your AAC device
- ✓ ***become a more competent computer user***
 - Interface your AAC device with a computer
 - Back up and transfer information
 - Learn word processing and other functions
 - Access the Internet
 - Subscribe to Augmentative Communication OnLine Users Group (ACOLUG)
- ✓ ***develop a vision and a plan for employment, post-secondary education and community living***
