Topic: General Aviation Security

General Aviation refers to: Private, Corporate and Public Safety planes

There are 5,380 paved general aviation airports and 5,180 unpaved and 372 commercial airports. The general aviation airports help reduce traffic at the commercial airports.

The Civil Air Patrol is an important arm of general aviation as it provides search and rescue services to state and local authorities.

The current program for general aviation security is AOPA. Its focus is on general security awareness of unusual events and criminal activity.

The basic tools supporting this program are: fencing, CCTV, enhanced lighting, signs, access controls along with security and police personnel.

Controls that are used on planes are: prop locks, key control and locks on the throttle and doors.

The General Security Hotline for reporting suspicious activity is 1-866-427-3287. As with any emergency you are encouraged to call 911 if in doubt.

A study was undertaken and the airports that adopted the AOPA program saw a drop in the crime rates associated with their facility.

Focus on Careers in Security

Prior to accepting a teaching position at Lackawanna College as an instructor in the Criminal Justice program, Professor Gary Shoener completed over twenty years of full-time service with the Pennsylvania State Police, mainly in Criminal Investigation. He also has 25 years of cumulative experience in various teaching positions. These include teaching at Lackawanna College in the Act 120 program, conducting in-service training for municipal police officers and working in various segments of the Constable program. In addition, Mr. Shoener has taught at the Scranton State School for the Deaf, Tempesta Driving School (a private school) and various other programs. Based on his background and success in the classroom, he was promoted to a Tenured Assistant Professor in the Criminal Justice Degree Studies at Lackawanna College.

Mr. Shoener's academic credentials include a Master of Science Degree in Education of the Hearing Impaired from Bloomsburg University and a Bachelor of Science Degree in Secondary Education with a concentration in Mathematics and Sciences from East Stroudsburg University. He graduated from the Pennsylvania State Police Academy

Mr. Shoener began his career with the Pennsylvania State Police, where he continued to apply his teaching background and

experience to the development of the Department's needs in various areas of instruction. Mr. Shoener was particularly involved in the state police Peer Contact Program and a youth oriented program known as Camp Cadet. During his tenure with the Pennsylvania State Police, he was promoted to the rank of Corporal. Some of his specialized trainings and areas of expertise include: Criminal Investigation; Firearm Instructor, a Graduate of one of the Commonwealth first "TOP GUN" class hosted by the PA Office of the Attorney General and the Pa State Police; Drug Unit Supervisor Training (DUST) hosted by the New Jersey State Police. Mr. Shoener's last duty assignment was the unit supervisor of a Tactical Drug Team/ Bureau of Drug Law Enforcement.

Currently, he is serving Lackawanna College as its Director of Public Safety. The Department of Public Safety is charged with providing a safe learning environment and providing asset protection services on a 24 hours/ 7 day a week basis. The Department is currently staffed with twelve full time officers and several part time positions.

Most recently, Director Shoener was awarded the coveted designation of Certified Protection Professional (CPP®) by the

Professional Certification Board (PCB) of the American Society for Industrial Security (ASIS).

In order to earn this designation, Director Shoener had to comply with stringent eligibility requirements that demonstrate that he had met certain education and/or work experience qualifications including employment for a minimum of three years in the security profession in a responsible charge position. Director Shoener then had to pass a comprehensive examination that tested knowledge and skills in major areas of security management.

Director Shoener is one of only 5,500 active CPPs® who have obtained this coveted designation since this certification program was instituted in 1977.

Mr. Shoener and his wife, Michele who is a Para-Professional in the North Pocono School District, have one son, David. Mr. Shoener and his wife reside in Moscow, Pennsylvania.
