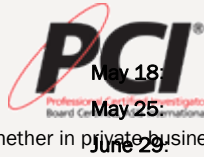

MILTON E. (Mick) MORITZ, CPP is the President of Moritz Associates Inc. in Harrisburg, Pennsylvania. With more than forty years of security experience, he has developed, implemented and operated a wide variety of security programs.

Mick entered the private sector on retirement from the US Army. Multi-lingual, his 20-year career was focused primarily in counterintelligence with significant European assignments. He was the Security Director of Sprint/United Telephone Eastern from 1972 to 1994. He gained his Healthcare security experience while serving as Safety and Security Director at Harrisburg Hospital, Harrisburg, PA prior to joining Sprint/United.

He was the President of the American Society for Industrial Security (Now ASIS International) in 1986 and Chairman of the Board in 1987. He served as the chairman of numerous ASIS committees. He organized workshops on Telecommunications Security and Privacy and Personnel Information Management. He was the academic advisor for the ASIS Assets Protection Course (Concepts and Methods) and he served on the faculty of the ASIS Professional Certification Review Course for many years.

Mr. Moritz was a part-owner of POA Publishing Company LLC and served as the Deputy Editor of the Protection of Assets Manual. He was a contributing author of numerous chapters in the POA Manual and he has been published in numerous periodicals. He lectures and consults on secu-

rity topics domestically and internationally.

Mr. Moritz studied at the University of Maryland and Florida State University.
