Speaker: James Troeblinger, Human Resources RF Fager

Topic: Focus on HR and Security as a partnership

The point was made that Security and HR must share a concern for who is hired which means having a good collaboration relationship. Mr. Troeblinger outlined key areas that require good communication and in depth collaboration by both parties to ensure that company assets are being protected by best in class programs.

Employee Safety: A secure and safe work environment that can protect against domestic violence as well as workplace violence.

Controlled Access: Appropriate security controls to the premises.

Mutual Respect & Trust: Being able to work together and reach out to HR or Security if issues arise in the workplace.

Professional Organizations: An excellent opportunity for both disciplines to learn more about the other and build a stronger relationship.

Community links Shared: EAP, Law enforcement which may provide information of interest to both.

Investigations: When facts are known whether for discipline or termination HR and Security have to talk.

Workplace Trends: IT moving forward in its controls HR has to know the planned control and how they will affect employees.

Employee Fraud: Both disciplines have to share responsibilities in protecting the company assets.

Top Management: Team up to offer council to senior management

Employee Handbooks: HR and Security both have to have topic input to the Handbook for employee awareness and understanding.

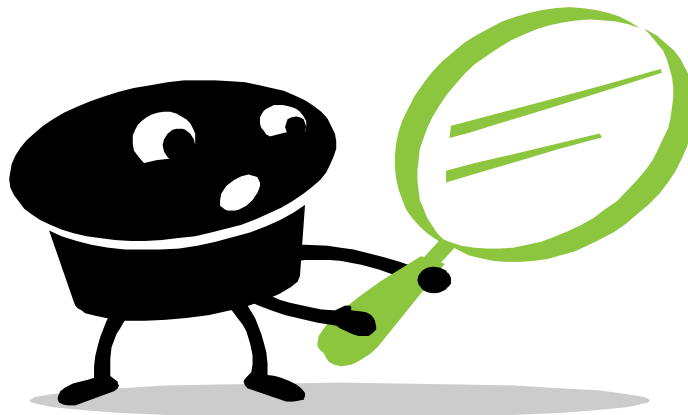
