DUI/Drug Facts

42,000 people die every year on US highways. Approximately 36% are DUI related. In PA, there were 12,695 impaired driving related crashes in 2009 resulting in 442 deaths. Alcohol-related deaths accounted for 36% of the 442 deaths, the same as in 2005, 2006, and 2007.

According to SMAHSA National Household Survey there are 19.5million illicit drug users (12 years and older)

There are 119,000 heroin users (up 300% in last 10 years)

56,000 12 to 17 year olds are dependent on inhalants

15.1million abuse prescription drugs

3.3million Americans used an ADHD substance in 2010

Of the 30.7million drivers who reported driving the influence, only 3.9% were arrested for DUI.

10.8% of high school seniors reported using illicit drugs in the previous year – 6.1% if the same respondents reported use during the month prior to the survey.

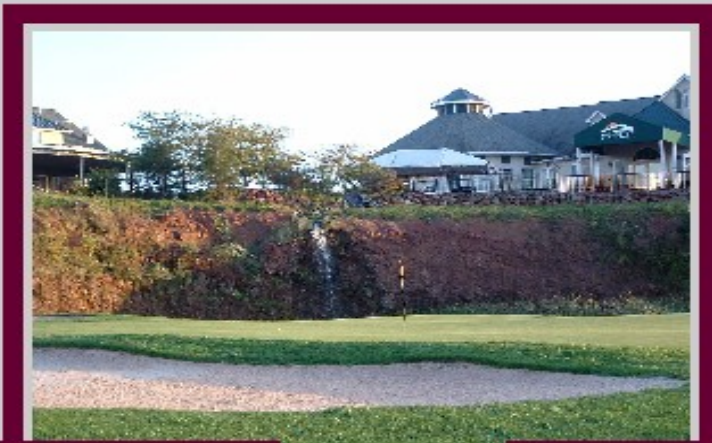

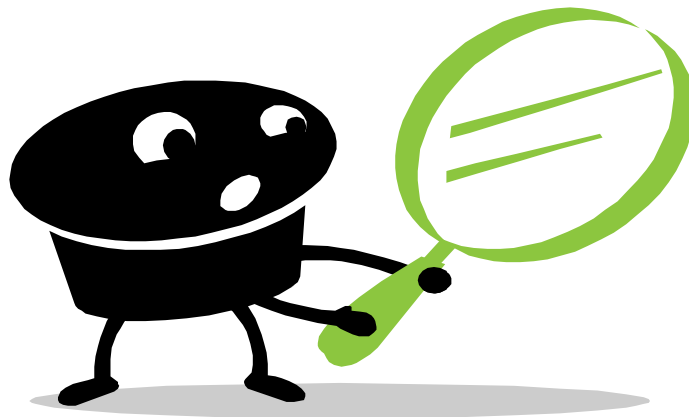
