Republican Wins and Democrat Losses

- ✓ Prioritizes national security and continues to rebuild our military after years of neglect by the Obama Administration.
- ✓ Funds the border wall, providing \$1.375 billion in new funding.
- ✓ Maintains the President's authority to transfer funds for the border wall.
- ✓ Includes no new restrictions on the President's ability to use funds for immigration and border enforcement activities.
- ✓ Funds the Trump Administration's request for the U.S. Marshals Service's Federal Prisoner Detention program to address rapidly increasing detainee population levels resulting from the Administration's stepped-up enforcement of firearm, drug, and immigration violations.
- ✓ Protects the number of Immigration and Customs Enforcement detention beds, thwarting attempts by Democrats to reduce the number.
- ✓ Provides funds to hire 1,200 additional Customs and Border Protection officers and 100 new border protection processing coordinators.
- ✓ Stops attempts by the Democrats to weaken pro-life protections by maintaining all prior-year, pro-life funding restrictions and not including any new hostile language.
- ✓ Removes a provision that would have restricted the Trump Administration's efforts to provide affordable alternatives to expensive Obamacare plans.
- ✓ Secures the largest pro-life victory in a generation by maintaining the Trump Administration's title X Family Planning regulations, which have resulted in abortion providers - such as Planned Parenthood - voluntarily leaving the federal program.

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- ✓ Eliminates riders that Democrats included in their bills, which would have done the following:
 - Allowed taxpayer dollars to fund lawyers for migrants arriving at our southern border;
 - Prevented funds from being used to litigate cases against the Affordable Care Act;
 - Restricted the President's ability to withdraw from the Paris Climate Agreement;
 - Short-circuited the federal environmental review process to stop mining in Alaska;
 - Kept in place the Obama Administration light bulb rule limiting consumer choice;
 - Prohibited the Treasury Forfeiture Fund from being used for the border wall;
 - Prohibited any new offshore conventional energy production;
 - Prevented the Trump Administration from implementing commonsense fuel efficiency standards for automobiles;
 - Prevented the Administration from replacing the Obama-era Clean Power Plan and Mercury and Air Toxics Standards (MATS) rules;
 - Weakened America's domestic supply of uranium;
 - Blocked domestic energy production in the Arctic National Wildlife Refuge (ANWR);
 - Reinstated the Obama-era "Valuation Rule" for conventional energy production on federal and Indian lands;
 - Prevented the Department of Transportation from overriding local hours of service requirements that conflict with federal standards and from making common-sense hours of service changes to improve safety and efficiency;
 - Required the Department of Transportation to publish flawed safety data on trucking companies;
 - Prevented the Administration from reviewing the immigration status of families receiving HUD assistance; and
 - Limited D.C. private schools from participating in the Scholarships for Opportunity and Results (SOAR) Act.

- ✓ Rejects efforts by Democrats to repeal long-standing protections, which would have done the following:
 - Eliminated long-standing Second Amendment protections and allowed funds to be used to implement the United Nations Arms Trade Treaty;
 - Allowed the listing of sage-grouse under the Endangered Species Act, which could limit energy and mineral development in 11 western states;
 - Enabled harmful environmental policies in the Green New Deal to go into effect, including the regulation of greenhouse gas emissions from livestock production; and
 - Allowed funding for United Nations peacekeeping operations above the statutory cap of 25 percent.
