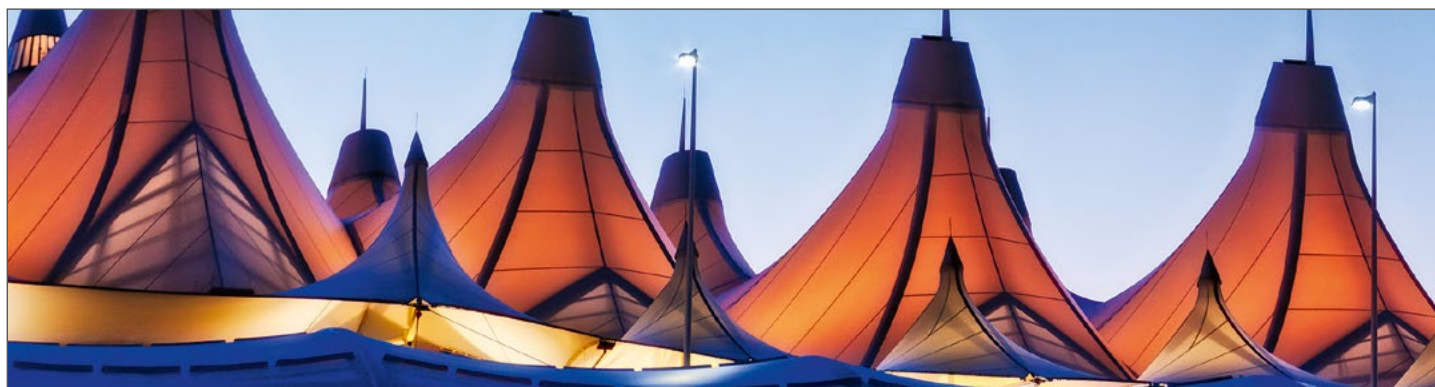

## Speech summary

### “The Changing Legal Marketplace and What It Means for Professional Service Firms”

The staid, precedent-bound legal guild is morphing into something entirely different. The confluence of three powerful developments has accelerated this process during the past decade – the financial crisis, remarkable advances in technology, and globalization. Disaggregation – peeling away “legal” tasks from law firms and

performing them from other provider sources – is reshaping the legal landscape. Artificial intelligence, blockchain, and new technologies are transforming many labor-intensive tasks into products and automating them. Legal buyers are demanding “better, faster, cheaper” legal services and are open to exploring new provider sources.

This is the backdrop of challenge and opportunity that confronts professional service firms engaging in or considering entry into the legal marketplace. The presentation will examine the marketplace with a focus on the buyer perspective and the importance of differentiation.

## International Taxation (ITPG)

Abigail Kan and Joseph Moed (Kanish & Partners, Toronto, ON) will first talk about “Doing Business in Canada and Canadians Doing Business in the US”. In his presentation, he will look Canada's tax system and planning opportunities. He will also look at foreign companies conducting on business in Canada, including common examples.

Carrying on with the Canadian theme, Robert Worthington (Nerland Lindsey, Calgary, AB) will discuss “Reducing Canadian Corporate Tax on Investment Income”.

Oliver Biernat (Benefitax, Frankfurt, Germany), ITPG Global Chairperson, will provide an ITPG Global Tax Update before the group breaks for coffee.

After the break, Howard Bakrins (Kutchins, Rob-

bins & Diamond, Chicago, IL) will cover the topic of “USA – 2017 Tax Cuts and Jobs Act: Provisions Affecting Businesses in the US” by looking at the new corporate tax regime, including full expensing of additions, relief for pass-through entities with Qualified Business Income, and quasi-territorial systems.

Fernando Lopez (Prager Metis, New York) will follow with “USA – 2017 Tax Cuts and Jobs Act: Provisions Affecting International Business”. He will look at tax optimization for exporters after US tax reform; as well as utility of IC-DISC, applying GLTI, and opportunities relating to FDII.

There will then be a panel discussion on “US Tax Reform” moderated by Jeffery L. Mowery (Mowery & Schoenfeld, Chicago, IL), followed by Q&A on all topics presented.

## Combined Meeting: Indirect Taxes + Tax Controversy & Tax Audit Defence

Friday, 22 June 2018 | Round I | 14:30 – 15:30

Pablo Garciga (Funaro & Co., New York, NY) will provide an update on the expansion of the Economic Nexus principle to sales taxes and a discussion of the relevant arguments in the briefs filed in the South Dakota v. Wayfair case currently before the US Supreme Court. The decision is expected sometime this summer and it may dramatically change the way the sales tax nexus is viewed in the US. Last fall and this spring, Peter M. Oettinger (Wegner CPAs, Madison, WI) was involved as an expert witness in the defense of a US taxpayer who has an operating business in an S corporation and who paid rent to his related LLC entity partnership that owned the real estate where his office was located. This is a fairly standard and well-used

tax strategy and liability planning strategy used in the US. The IRS brought a criminal tax complaint against the taxpayer for this strategy and was able to obtain a conviction on six counts of false subscription. False subscription in the US means the IRS believes the tax return forms as filed and prepared by third party CPA tax preparers were misleading and criminally false as filed with the IRS and a jury of 12 agreed with the IRS. Pete will show copies of some of the relevant tax returns and discuss the mistakes made by the tax preparers and how to protect ourselves from our clients. This case also has interesting issues as it relates to state and local tax in the state of Ohio, but which may apply in other states as well.

**(1) New Salary History Bans Change Hiring Practices.** Over the past year, numerous state and local governments across the US have enacted salary history bans. Generally, these laws ban employers and recruiters from asking an applicant about their current or past salary, which may include bonuses and benefits and other types of compensation. The aim of the salary history ban is pay equity. In addition, recent Court of Appeals cases have addressed the issue of the use of salary his-

tory under the Equal Pay Act. We will be discussing salary history bans and the Equal Pay Act and how to manage the competing interests of employers to hire employees at a fair but competitive wage.

**(2) Current developments and trends in employment law.** Time-permitting, we will discuss current employment law developments and other topics the participants may like to discuss.

The meeting will be interesting not only for Labor Practice group members, but all GGI members. We welcome the exchange of ideas from all participants. All are welcome!

Experience drop-offs of over 1000' on the 'Oh-My-God' road made famous by Ulysses S. Grant in 1872. Tour an 1871 gold mine and, if time allows, pan for gold in a clear mountain stream. It's the perfect Colorado mining experience.
